

## Capacity Building Project: Disability Inclusive SDGs

Conducted by KDF, until the end of the year 2019

### A. Description

The objective of this project is to discuss effective strategies to engage multiple stakeholders in implementing disability-inclusive SDGs.

The expected outcomes are to strengthen partnership among diverse stakeholders from CSOs, governments and private sectors with a view to accelerate engagement of disability communities in the process of developing national SDGs and to mainstream disability issues in the national plan on SDGs.

The strategic value to this project is to support disability-rights advocates to be equipped with sufficient knowledge and strategies both on CRPD and SDGs, so that disability communities can be more actively engaged in the whole process of developing and implementing national SDGs.

The project is composed of three activities, as follows,

1. Participation in the UN ESCAP North-East Asian Multi-stakeholder Forum on SDG, which will be held between 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> October in Vladivostok, Russia.
2. Providing capacity building training on disability-inclusive SDGs, between 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> November in Seoul, in South Korea.
3. Korean disability community to make suggestion to make the current K-SDGs more disability-inclusive, through on-going partnership with the Ministry of Environment and with the Ministry of Foreign affairs.
